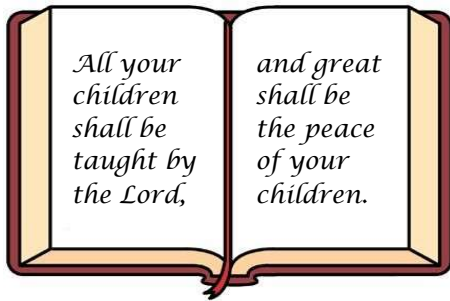

PASTOR'S PEN

One of the essential features of being human beings is our dependency on other people and things. Of course, as people grow up we encourage and train them to be independent of their parents and to find their own paths in life. But even fully functioning adults can't escape their dependence.

First of all, we are dependent on God and parents to be conceived and born. We don't create ourselves or give ourselves life. Infants don't survive without the care and protection of parents or parent figures. Children don't learn enough to become successful adults without depending on school systems, teachers, and administrators to keep the educational machine running.

It's almost impossible for adults to be totally self-sufficient. Someone built a house for them. Banks provide financing to own that home or landlords provide rental units. Most of us can't do our jobs without depending on coworkers to help us and companies to be true to their word about paying us for our labor.

We are not our own doctors and nurses, police, firefighters and first responders. We can't control how good other people are at their jobs, but we depend on their competence. Romans 13:1 tells us that God provides government to restrain and punish evil and protect us from harm through the legal system and military. We are constantly reliant on these institutions. It's downright scary how dependent we are on the internet and digital technology for our power grid and to protect us from cyber-crime.

We don't control the sun and the stars and the forces of nature. We are dependent on the goodness of God for these things. Jesus said in the Sermon on the Mount in Matthew's Gospel that God is good to all creatures in regard to his providing the right conditions to preserve life. He sends the sun and the rain on the just and the unjust alike.

Sinners are in denial of how dependent human life is. Or perhaps many just put it out of their minds. But November and the season of thanksgiving is a powerful reminder of how things really are. What can make us thankful? Acknowledging our dependency and seeing that God comes through for us all the time. His daily gifts never stop coming.

In light of the cross that should not be surprising. Through Christ's death and resurrection, God overcomes the most difficult enemies of the human race: sin, death, and the power of evil. How much more will he provide for all our needs?

It's okay to be dependent as long as we have God who constantly gives us reasons to be thankful and showers us with his daily mercies. Faith sees the goodness in all of these realities and creates thankful hearts. May you and your families be given the opportunity to celebrate on our national day of Thanksgiving, November 28.

CALL COMMITTEE REPORT

The Call Committee recently conducted a second interview with a pastoral candidate, including dinner and tours of the communities of Brandon and Dell Rapids. We were pleased to have her present a sermon and lead us in a hymn. She is a pastor who is currently in a call (pastor of a church), and has also interviewed with another church in the state. The Call Committee made a unanimous decision to recommend that we call her to Heritage Lutheran. We brought a draft letter of call to the Council which was approved and forwarded on to her for consideration, to see if she was open to a congregational meet and greet and vote. She did pay a visit to the church after the letter was sent, to pray in our space, and also had coffee with some members of the call committee to discuss the draft letter.

Last week we received a letter of withdrawal that we would like to share:

Thank you so much for considering me for the position of pastor of Heritage Lutheran Church. I greatly appreciated the hospitality and fellowship extended to me and my husband as I came to interview several weeks ago, and again as I met with Beth, Mike and Jim a few days ago. Thank you, too, for the draft letter of call you afforded me opportunity to consider. As (my husband) and I have prayed during the past week about the possibility of my serving as your pastor, we have at last come to the disappointing conviction that I should withdraw my name from further consideration for this position. I see so many profound strengths and exciting possibilities for your congregation, and I am confident the Lord will lead you into growing impact in your wonderful community. I sense, however that my informal style and more charismatic theological worldview would hinder our ability to minister together effectively.

I will continue to pray for you as your pastoral search resumes. May God bring you a pastoral candidate well-suited to your congregational culture and well-equipped to join you in serving the mission of Jesus Christ in Brandon and beyond.

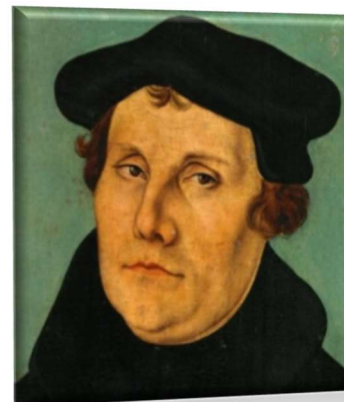
